Student Conduct / Chapter Re-Recognition:

- 1) Work TOGETHER with Student Conduct office, CFSL staff and Alumni and Undergraduates provide comments and recommendations for improvement.
- 2) Review all Student Conduct policies and make recommendations for improvement
- 3) Provide a template for "Chapter Re-Recognition Requirements" that is fair and consistent. Also develop a system that attempts to have chapters back on track as soon as they have completed/accomplished/satisfied the "chapter re-recognition requirements"... There is nothing good that comes from continuing to try and hit a moving target for re-recognition... it frustrates the alumni that are trying to guess what the university wants, it frustrates the undergraduates, it frustrates the university staff, it continues to hold chapters out for extended periods of time rather than assist them with getting back on track... often times it punishes undergraduates that were in elementary or middle school when the infraction that originally occurred caused the university to remove recognition... this is senseless and too focused on the negative rather than on the positive (what are the requirements? Meet or exceed them and your good to go...) The requirements should not be simple however and should definitely require that both alumni involvement and documented undergraduate training, possible membership reviews/interviews and some removal occur prior to moving forward with the process of re-recognition...
- 4) Review alcohol policy (see Facilities above) and make recommendations for improvement. Review the possibility of a banquet permit concept within the chapters on an approved basis. Chapters would be responsible for adhering to State law, etc...
- 5) Identify a way in which WSU Student Conduct can work together with chapters to take action with expelled members as they become a negative nuisance and are likely not suitable for representing WSU as a student or eventually as an alumna.
- 6) Provide sample new member education / initiation plan and make available to all chapters
- 7) Provide sample risk management plan and make available to all chapters
- 8) Provide sample scholarship plan and make available to all chapters
- 9) Provide a sample of all related or helpful plans that can be found, offered up by current chapters, national headquarters, etc...

WSU Greek Student Conduct Improvement Team Action Item Schedule

May 31st: Finalize Survey Summary and share with GAO Officer Team.

June 10th: Confirm Chairpersons for each team. Provide each team with time-line completion expectations, etc...

June 15th: Confirm/add 3-8 people in addition to the Chairperson for each team. **Chairperson is responsible for filling out team.** (Include all appropriate representation)

July / Aug: Work the issues and develop recommendations with expectation the team will have completed their work on or before August 31st

September 4th: Share a summary of the team's work at a September 4th GAO afternoon meeting in Pullman to include all interested parties on Friday prior to the first home game (Stanford, Sept 5th). Lewis Alumni Center (Jim Zuba)

September 10th: During WSU Fall Foundation Meetings share GAO update/recommendations with all in attendance. (10am - 12pm, on Thursday the 10th of September @ Seattle Sheraton) (Jim Zuba to confirm)
